OUR HISTORY



Alfred R. Kahn (founder of 4Kids Entertainment) hosted the first annual Thanksgiving Parade Breakfast in November, 2001 – just after the 9/11 tragedy. His hope was to provide the families of the first responders lost in the line of duty with a positive, supportive and festive atmosphere as they entered what was sure to be a very difficult holiday season. The event was even more powerful for the children and families than Mr. Kahn could have imagined. The overwhelmingly grateful response from these families underscored for Al that the impact of each loss was going to last a *lifetime*.

And what of those families who face tragic line of duty losses every day without the massive support provided after a major disaster? In 2002 the NLEAFCF was incorporated There as a national organization that could be there to help families *across the country*.

While continuing the tradition of the annual Thanksgiving Breakfast, the NLEAFCF began distributing grants in 2005. The very first \$2,500 grant went to support the DEA Survivor Fund in Washington, DC. By 2006 another \$60,000 had been disbursed to first responder families covering medical bills, family therapy and other emergency needs in addition to funding the production of PSA's for fire safety. Each year new organizations and new families receive our support.

To date, the NLEAFCF has distributed **over \$780,000** awarding **206 scholarships** and **83 grants** to families and organizations in **36 states**. Another **\$1,300,000** has been spent on **family-friendly programming and events** such as our annual Thanksgiving Parade Breakfast for the families of our fallen heroes.





LINE OF DUTY FATALITIES





Day in and day out, our nation's law enforcement officers and firefighters put their lives on the line to keep us safe.

Each year an average of **120** firefighters perish in the line of duty and tens of thousands are injured.* Many of these are volunteer firefighters without pension programs or unions to support the ongoing need of their families.

An average of one law enforcement death occurs every 53 hours – an average of 171 deaths per year. In the past 10 years, over 1,400 law enforcement officers gave their lives protecting the public.**

These brave first responders are able to step in harm's way each day because they believe the community will be there to protect and care for their families should the ultimate tragedy occur. The NLEAFCF strives to serve this need.

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS



Since 2005, the NLEAFCF has distributed over \$780,000 for 289 scholarships and grants across 36 states.

College Scholarships – NLEAFCF scholarships recognize financial need, academic merit and other achievements including demonstrated leadership in volunteering to benefit the community and outstanding performance in sports or the arts.

In addition to our general scholarship fund, the NLEAFCF administers two memorial scholarship funds honoring individuals whose lives were dedicated to supporting first responders — the Victoria Ovis Memorial Scholarship and the Vincent Bennett, Jr. Memorial Scholarship.

Grants to families – NLEAFCF individual grants provide financial assistance for an immediate need due to the tragic circumstances for line of duty and active duty families.

Grants to Law Enforcement and Fire Department Organizations - NLEAFCF organizational grants support, promote, and facilitate educational activities or programs, run by entities affiliated with law enforcement or fire departments, which educate and benefit the children in their communities.





LOOKING FORWARD



The NLEAFCF will celebrate our 15th anniversary in September of 2017. As we look toward that milestone we have committed to a five-year strategic plan designed to build the national footprint of the organization and establish an ambitious endowment fund that will ensure EVERY family enduring a line of duty loss will be provided with the support they need.

\$10,000,000 Endowment Fund by 2022

The scholarship awards we disburse each year fund 50% or less of the total requests we receive. At the same time, 290 families in the U.S. per year suffer a line-of-duty death.

Our long-term goal is to create an endowment large enough to allow us to provide an instant emergency grant for each line-of-duty death and to support to every child of a fallen first responder who seeks our help financing a college education. As we work toward that goal we focus on key areas of growth for the foundation in the coming year:

- Add support staff to facilitate foundation expansion with a focus on fundraising and corporate partnerships to help us achieve our endowment fund goals
- Expand our Board of Directors to facilitate broader national reach and exposure and to expand relationships with corporate and foundation partners
- · Develop additional programming in support of our mission
