Our program honors the sacrifices first responder families make by extending a financial lifeline when misfortune strikes.

Life can take unexpected turns, and the heroes who show up to save us are not immune from misfortune. Unforeseeable events such as a child's unexpected health issues, emergency household bills and unanticipated childcare needs can take a financial toll on first responder families. The resulting financial hardships all too often affect children the most.

FRCF awards one-time emergency grants to first responder families faced with these unanticipated circumstances. Hardship program funds cover expenses associated with child-care emergencies, expenses related to a child's sudden illness or housing insecurity due to circumstantial events such as fires or pandemics.

As the COVID-19 pandemic showed us, we live in a world where large-scale, nationwide emergencies are more and more likely, adversely impacting first responders. In addition to supporting those currently in need, this program can help ensure our heroes and their families are supported when the next large-scale emergency happens.
